Learning and sharing about Neuro-Sensory Integration is my passion, it has been an eye opening experience to see children, education (and parenting) in a different way. If we take a look at the child’s senses we will be able to better understand their behavior and, as a result, to better connect and train in the way they should go. Just as a good foundation is essential to support a building, a good foundation in a child’s body will allow him to explore, enjoy, and learn academic skills. Organizing the senses and the maturation of primary reflexes are important in the first three to eight years of life to effectively reduce or avoid a dysfunction later on. It is the groundwork for learning and positive behavior. Understanding child development affects and shapes our way to interact, teach and work with children. In this workshop, we will explore some of the foundational and major contributors to what we know today as Child Development and how we can bring their theories to practice inside our classrooms.
